## THE SOUTH GOODWIN LIGHTSHIP DISASTER: A MEMORIAL SERVICE FOR VICTIMS; AND THE REPLACEMENT LIGHTSHIP.

On Friday. One of the wreaths was from Mr. R. Murton, sight of the wrecked lightship. One of the wreaths was from Mr. R. Murton, the only surviver of the disaster. Immediately the loss of the lightship became

known, arrangements were made for a replacement vessel to be towed to the Goodwin Sands to maintain the ceaseless guard. This vessel can be seen, in Trinity House tender Vestal. Men can be seen painting the words "South Goodwin" for a distress fund to help dependants of the crew of the wrecked lighted An enquiry into the loss is being held by the Elder Brethren of Trinity House.
